To empower all citizens to own, understand and practice Constitutional values, rights and responsibilities in their lives and communities.

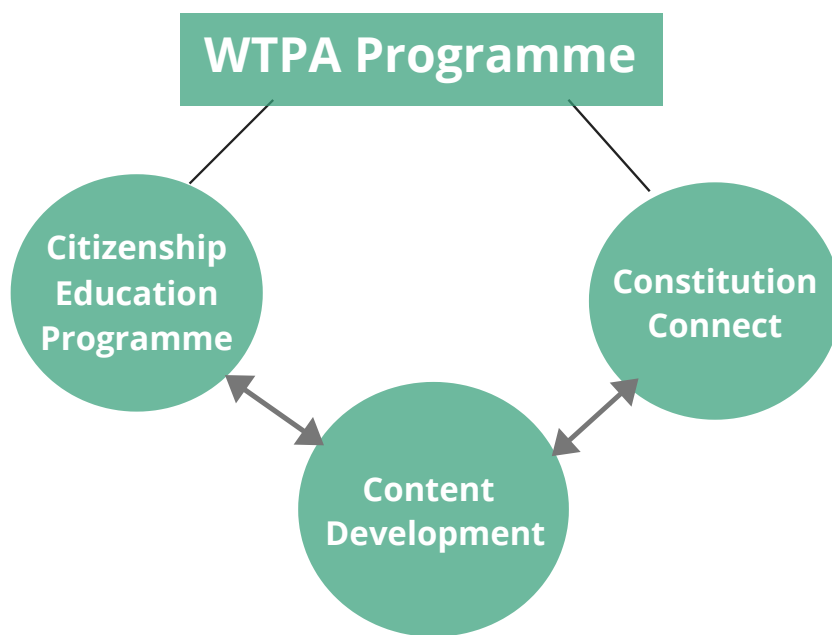


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This has been a year of extraordinary interest and awareness among citizens around our Constitution. True, it was a special year from the word go. On 26th January 2019, we entered the 70th year of the creation of the Indian Constitution. On 26th November 2019 we completed 70 years since the Constitution was adopted and 26th January 2020 marked completion of 70 years since it was enforced. These are all critical markers in the timeline of our journey as a democracy.

The Government of India issued special directives to all states for the celebration of these markers in schools and government departments. The media leaned in on stories around the Constitution. But two important events became pathways for citizen's interest in the Constitution, its spirit and its letter. These were the revocation of Article 370 and the Citizenship Amendment Act, 2019. Citizens, especially the youth, took to intricate reading of the relevant Articles and participating in meetings invoking the Preamble.

All these happenings have had a tremendous impact on our work and programme areas.

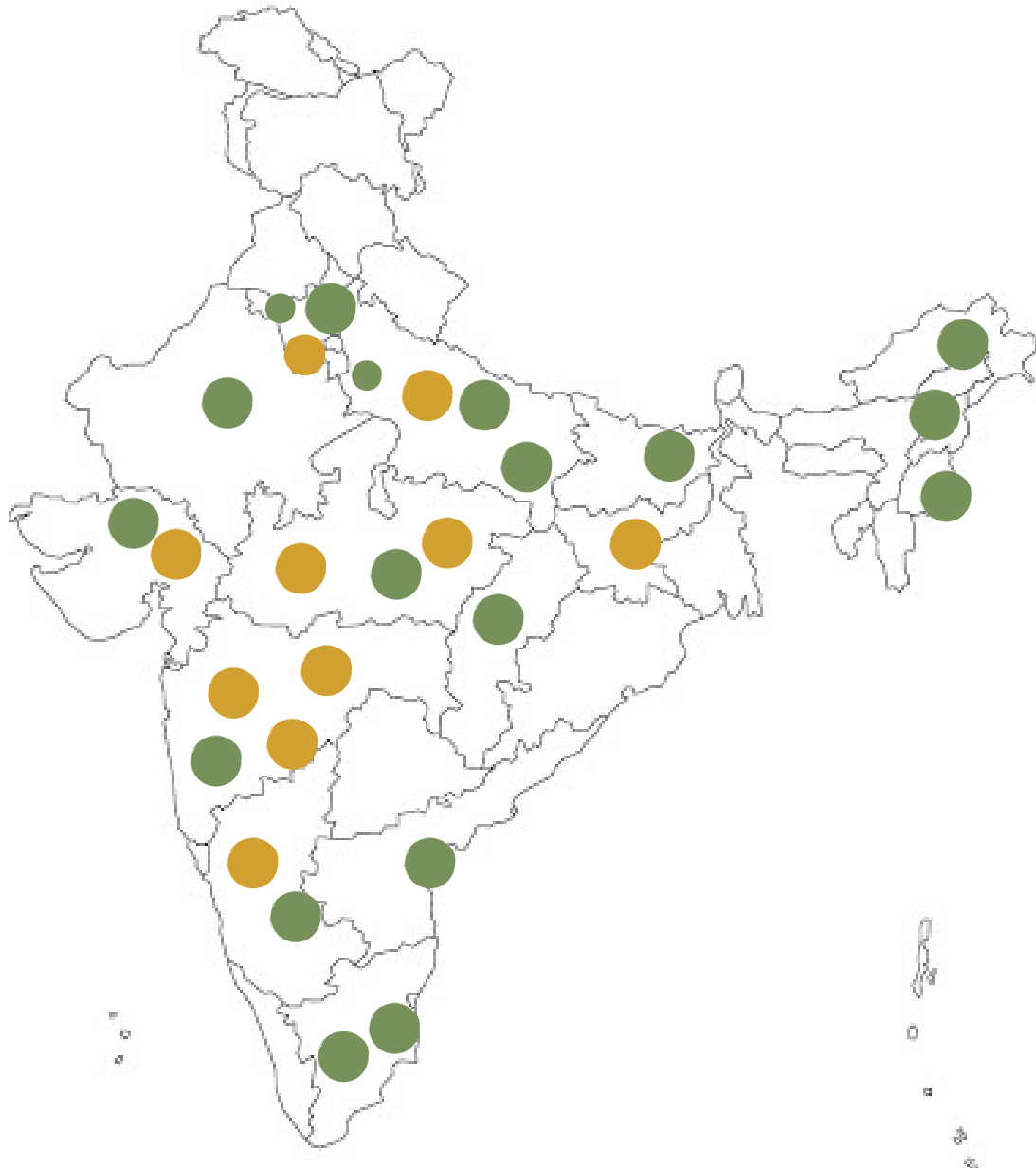


On Citizenship Education Programme, we collaborated with the Education department of Delhi Government to design and implement a programme on Constitutional values across all government schools. On Constitution Connect, we conceptualized and led a nationwide campaign, marking 70 years of the Constitution, called Mission 70.

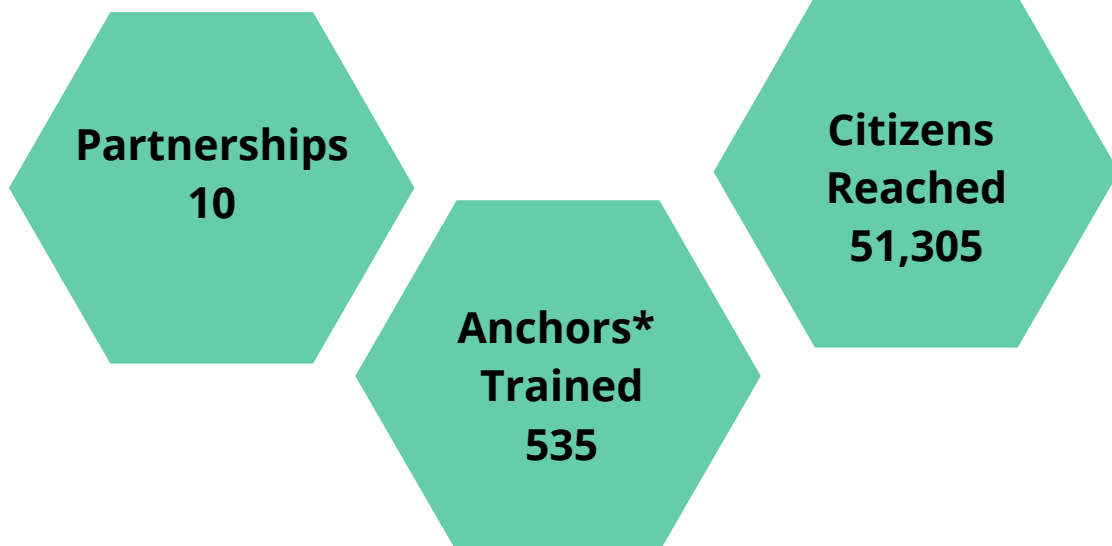

SECTION 1: PROGRAMME INSIGHTS

CITIZENSHIP EDUCATION PROGRAMME (CEP)

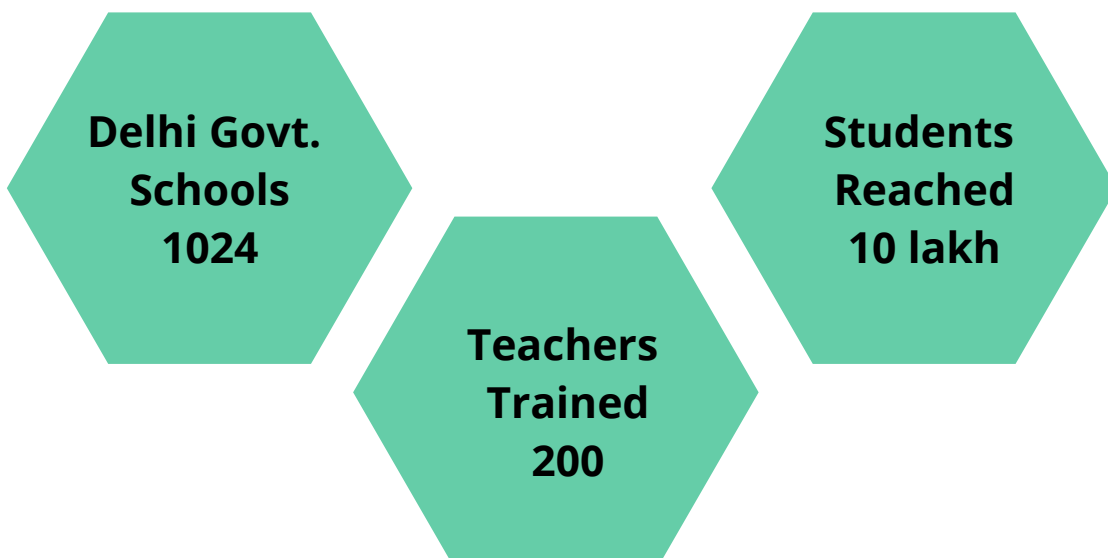
The Citizenship Education Programme is an intensive, foundational, capacity building programme for citizens aimed at enhancing Attitudes, Knowledge, and Skills. This programme is facilitated in partnership with other organisations: Educational Institutions and Civil Society Organisations (CSOs). The numbers emerging on CEP outreach have been:

This year has been particularly exciting as we expanded our work in different locations, partnering with several new organisations. Over the last many years, our main model of intervention has been Training of Trainers (TOT) which is a cascade model. Trainers work in the communities to train others. This year, we experimented with two new models.

First, is a campaign model in which the focus was to design for scale and replicability. We successfully implemented a state-wide campaign with Department of Education, Delhi. The campaign, Constitution at 70, aimed at connecting constitutional values to students' everyday life.

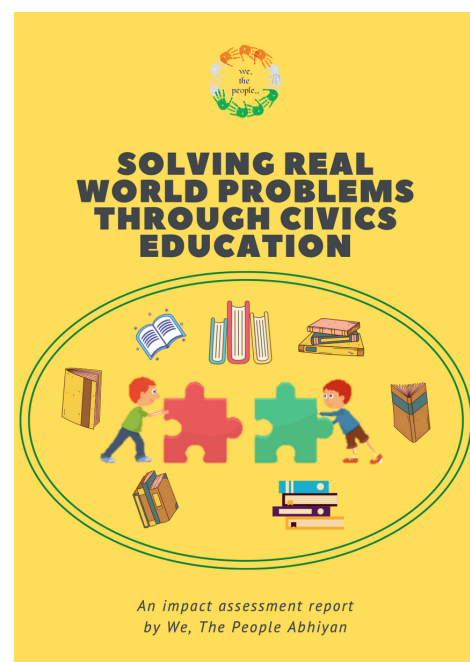
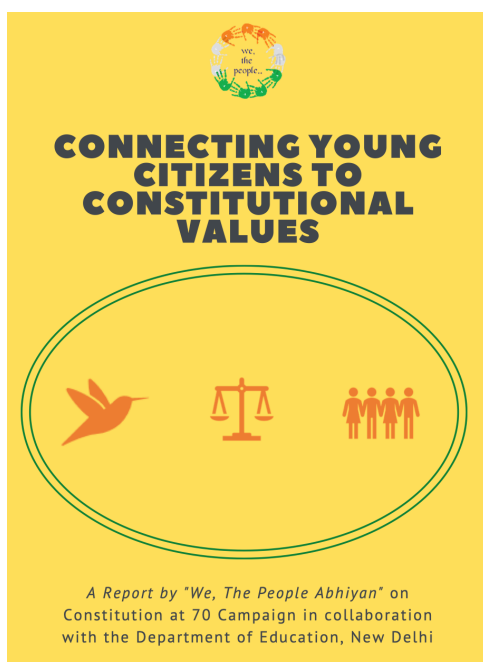
Second, we trained community leaders as mobilisers who facilitate constitutional understanding in the communities that they work in. WTPA engaged with several CSOs like CORO, PHIA, Utthan, PANI, and AALI as the capacity building partner of their Constitutional Values Fellowship program. We focused on building constitutional perspective of fellows through various cross learning workshops.

Acting on our learning from last year, we strengthened our monitoring and evaluation processes. We completed two impact assessment studies on our interventions with schools and will continue to do so with all other programs. Here is the link to the report on Delhi schools

Continuing our engagement with PRADAN, we have started another cycle of Civic literacy in Basia where we will train 40 Samvidhan Saathis to mobilise constitutional awareness and action in their panchayats. We have started another program with Jan Sahas to train 500 of their karyekartas working in 15 districts under Kishori Baalika Karykaram.



Four major learnings have emerged from this year:

- While nurturing existing partnerships to deepen our interventions, we need to build new partnerships through consistent and conscious prospecting,
- Experimentation and innovation in design/model of intervention needs to continue to cater the need of different partners/audiences/contexts,
- Campaign can be used as a tool to build awareness and energy around this subject in schools. It is less intensive and easier to execute on scale. This can be used as building block to long-term intervention with state education departments,
- M&E is critical for all interventions and to build demonstrable model for scale-up.

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CONSTITUTION CONNECT (CC)

Constitution Connect is the programme area that focuses on creating wider awareness about the Constitution. Usually this is done through facilitating short workshops and events like Citizen Cafés. But 2019 was not an usual year! So, to mark the 70th anniversary year, we initiated a campaign called Mission 70.

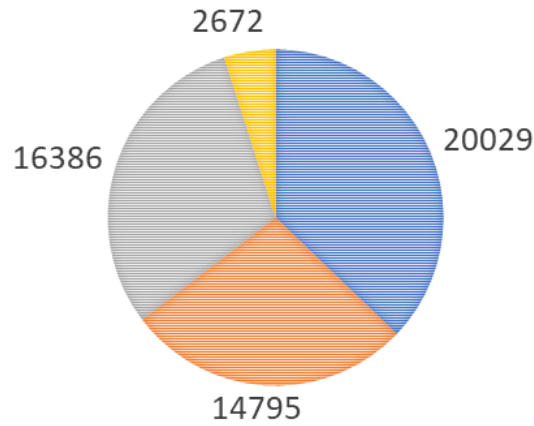

MISSION 70 was a national campaign that ran through the year – starting 26th January 2019 to 26th January 2020. A total of 23 organizations from across the country participated. The objective was to bring to the consciousness of young citizens, the connect of Constitutional values and rights in their everyday lives and provoke reflection and action. The overall message was “Constitution in Our Everyday Life”.

The strategy was to release a series of videos at different intervals through the year, on Youtube. The films were accompanied by workshop modules that Mission 70 partner organisations used to facilitate on-ground events with citizens. The films released on critical ‘hook’ dates through the year achieved substantial online reach, with Constitution in Cinema leading the race!

Some videos were also released by Youth Ki Awaaz on their channel taking the reach to over 1.5 lakh.

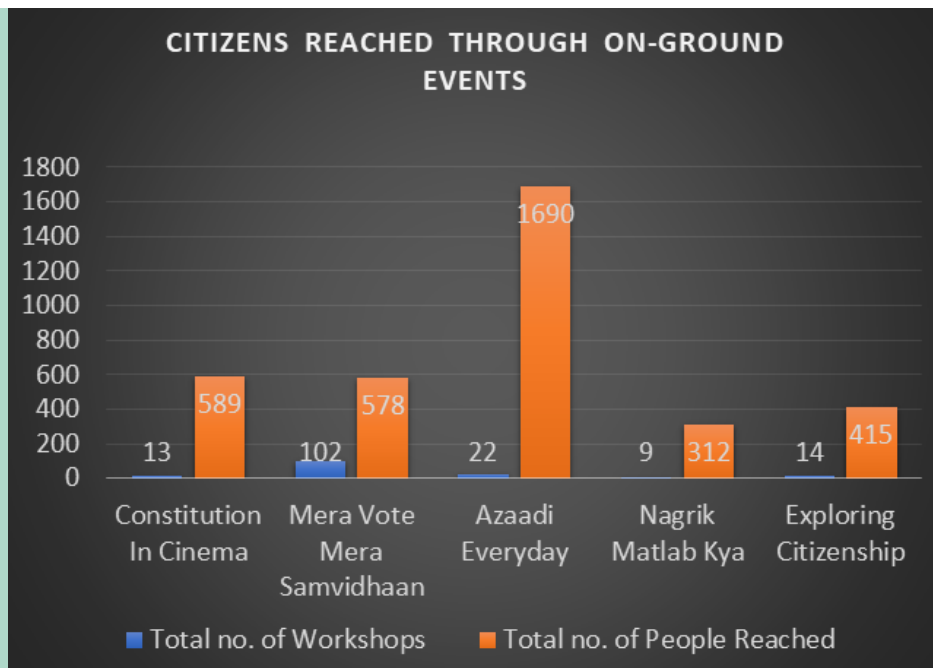

This graphic shows the number of workshops facilitated and citizens reached.



This graph does not include the reach of one of the M70 partners Vikas Samvad because of the sheer scale they achieved with the video series Mera Vote Mera Samvidhan. Singularly, they facilitated nearly 2000 events in different parts of Madhya Pradesh and reached more than 1,10,000 citizens.

CONTENT DEVELOPMENT

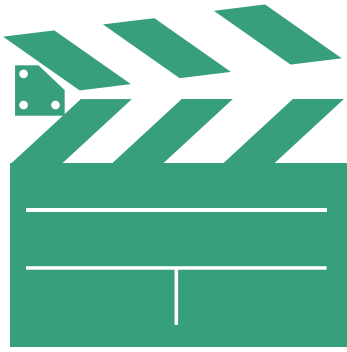
Content development is the engine of WTPA. It drives all our capacity building and awareness efforts towards active and responsible citizenship. The three fundamental questions that steer all our content development actions are: What shifts in the citizen's attitude/perspective are needed?, What information would a citizen need?, What skill and tools are needed to take action on the ground. It is answers to these questions that shape the design of each capacity building content.

Last year, we devoted considerable time and energy to the question around shifting attitudes and perspective. This resulted in the creation of well-crafted modules for CEP. It also created a special identity for our work in the area of constitutional understanding and awareness.

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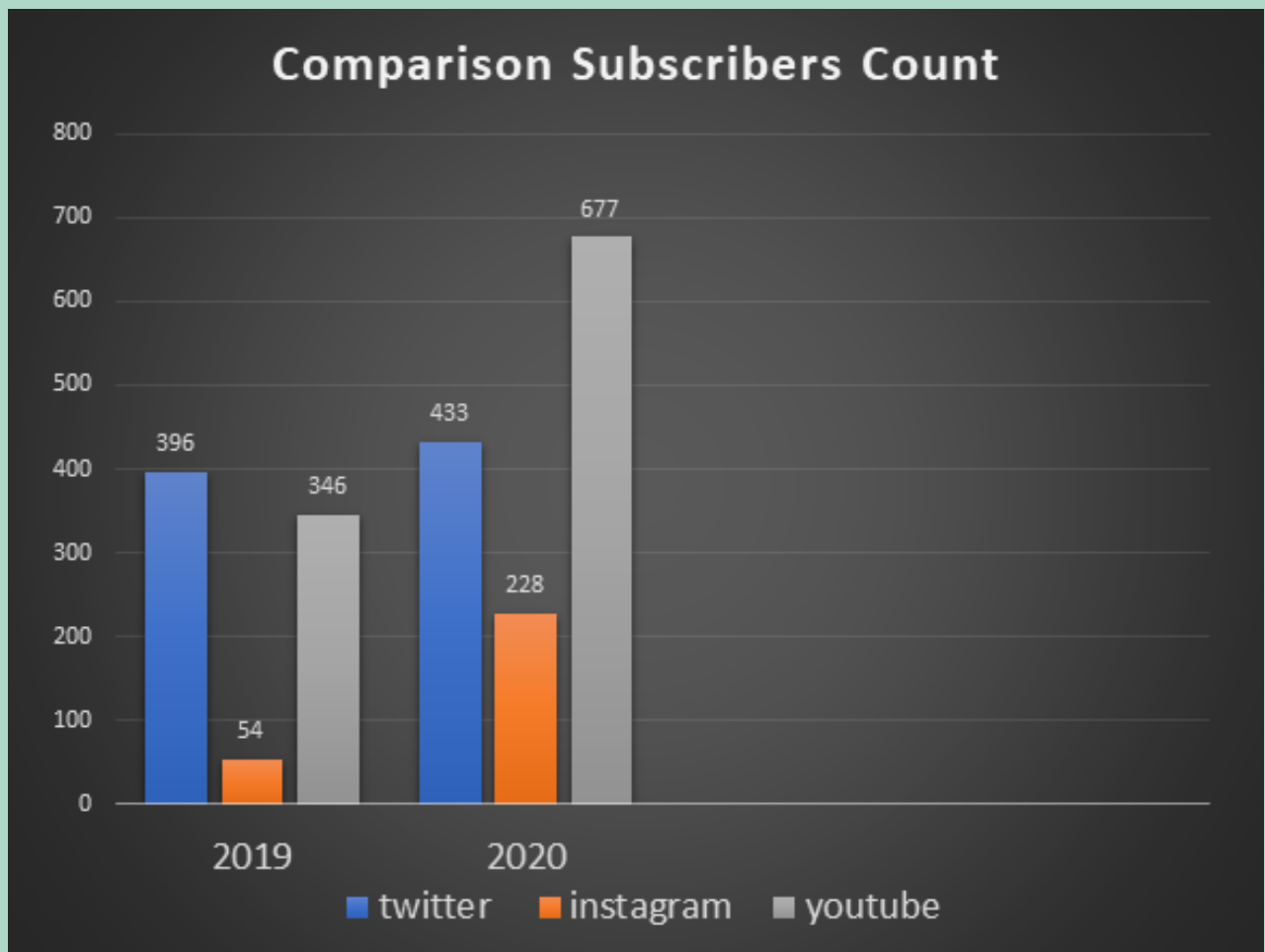


SECTION 2: ORGANISATION INSIGHTS

We, The People Abhiyan Through teacher training and citizenship empowerment activities

VINITA SINGH, 49, is a managing trustee of "We, The People Abhiyan", an eight-year-old organisation that aims to help citizens understand the power and responsibilities that the Constitution of India vests in them. Like Mumbai Collective, this Delhi-based group, comprises people from various backgrounds, including lawyers, engineers and academics. Singh, who has worked in social development for over two decades, says, "Social change can only happen within the framework of the Constitution, and this pivotal document, we found — in our interactions with people we came across in our respective lines of work —

is not understood." Singh, who became interested in improving livelihoods and opportunities for those who lived in rural India, when she was a student at Mumbai's St Xavier's College, thus got together with friends "to bridge the gap between the citizen and the Constitution". "We put together a 'citizenship empowerment programme', which trains people to be active citizens. We trained teachers, students, activists and then refined our workshops for the youth." The group, which has been working with the Delhi government for three years, and also with some schools in Maharashtra, ran a student-targeted programme in 2019.

Dubbed "The Constitution at 70", the programme was simple: Every month, educators were to pick a single value from the Preamble to the Constitution, and students' activities would be planned around this. "Take 'equality', for instance — students may do a survey to see how it plays out for the residents in their communities in daily life," says Singh. Aside from training teachers and activists to take their understanding forward, the group also runs "Constitution Connect", an outreach programme. Here, they conduct workshops and make appearances on talk shows, events and on radio channels to discuss the subject in detail.

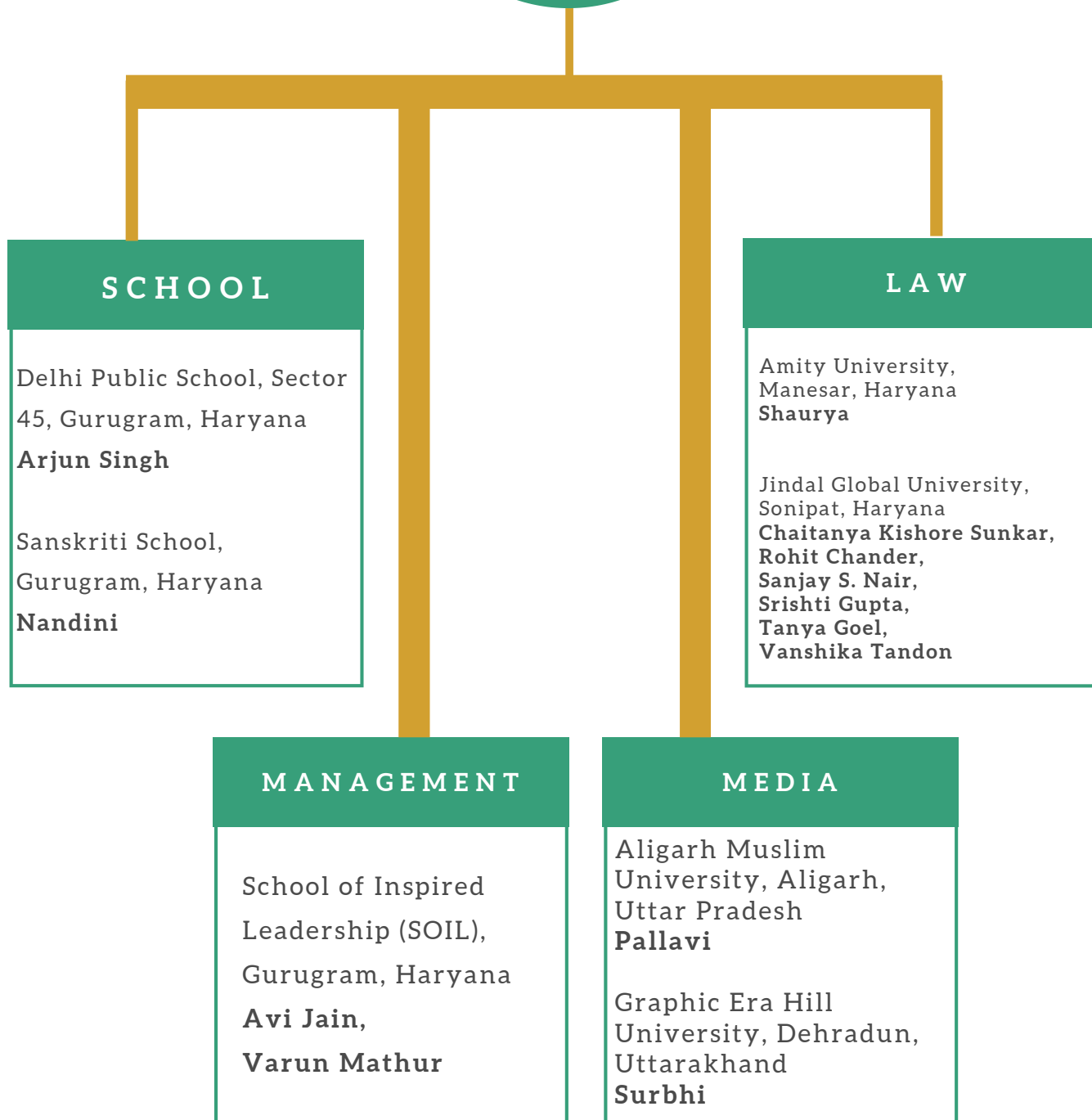

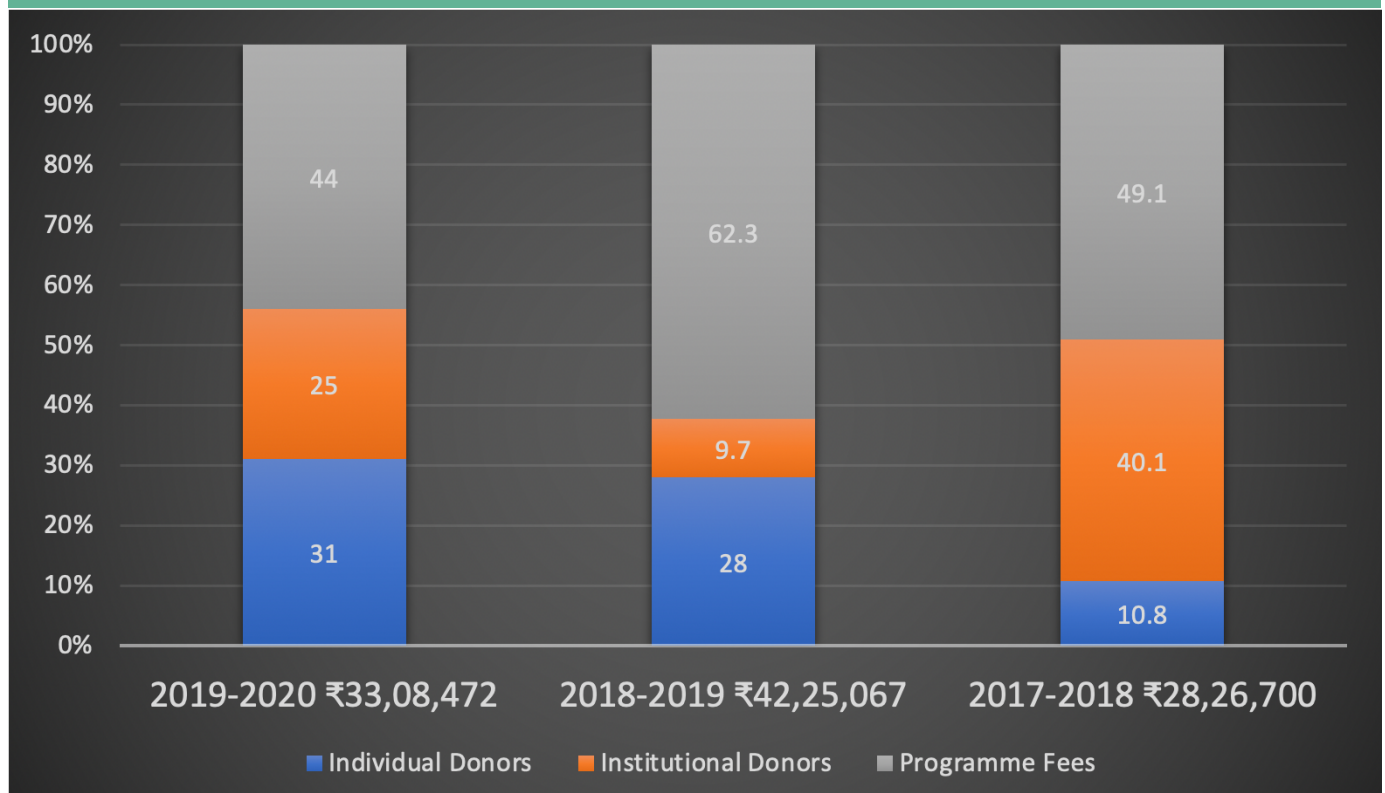
